A Gathering of Beekeepers

A Day with Dr. Tom Seeley

Put the date of Saturday, September 9 on your calendar. There will be a gathering of beekeepers organized by the Northern Illinois Beekeepers Association in the Leucht Conference Center at McHenry County College. This special meeting will begin at 10:00 am with a presentation by Dr. Thomas Seeley followed by a lunch break and a second presentation by Dr. Seeley.

Dr. Seeley is the head of the Department of Neurobiology and Behavior at Cornell University. More than his academic credentials he

is a passionate beekeeper. His two presentations will discuss the work of his two most recent books – *Honeybee Democracy* and *Following the Wild Bees*.

Dr. Seeley's research has looked to answer the questions many beekeeper have when they meet the workings of a honeybee colony. How can 50,000 insects work so well as a unit? How can a swarm of bees work together and agree on a new home? How do the bees communicate? The more time we spend with the bees the more we find their social behavior and decision making amazing. For 40 years, Dr. Seeley has worked to understand this phenomena and he will share his insights with us.

Following a lunch break Dr. Seeley will discuss his adventures in "beelining" - the topic of his book *Following the Wild Bees*. Dr. Seeley's talented use of his bee box has allowed him to follow the wild bees as they return to their native home. As part of his research he charted the decline and return of the wild bees in the Arnot Forest of New York State. He seeks to understand the seeming ability of the bees of the forest and varroa mites to coexist - a subject of interest to all beekeepers.
